Victoria day-trip — Located on Vancouver Island, where life is slower and more peaceful than in the big city, Victoria is the perfect blend of old colonial charm and a modern, small city. This tour takes you on a journey along the stunningly beautiful coastline with BC Ferries and give you lots of time to explore “The City of Gardens”. Victoria’s downtown is hip and full of history. You will travel by bus and take a BC ferry!

Stanley Park — Stanley Park is Vancouver’s first, largest, and most beloved urban park! Designated a national historic site of Canada, Stanley Park is a magnificent green oasis in the midst of the heavily built urban landscape of Vancouver. Explore the 400-hectare natural West Coast rainforest and enjoy scenic views of water, mountains, sky, and majestic trees along Stanley Park’s famous Seawall. Discover kilometers of trails, beautiful beaches, local wildlife, great eats, natural, cultural and historical landmarks, along with many other adventures. The park offers a wide range of unforgettable experiences

Lynn Valley Suspension Bridge — Lynn Canyon Park officially opened to the public in 1912 and has been a popular destination ever since. Lynn Canyon Park is a great location for a picnic or a refreshing swim in one of the many popular swimming holes. The park contains second growth forest with most of the trees aged approximately 80 to 100 years old. The suspension bridge sways 50 meters above the canyon. It was built privately in 1912 when the park opened. Lynn Canyon also offers a selection of walking trails that connect to other parks in the region such as Lynn Headwaters, Rice Lake, and Inter River Park

Museum of Anthropology — Just 20 minutes from downtown Vancouver, the UBC Museum of Anthropology houses one of the world’s finest displays of Northwest Coast First Nations art in a spectacular Arthur Erickson designed building overlooking the mountains and ocean. It also features extensive collections from around the world as well as a wide range of temporary exhibitions.

Vancouver Aquarium — As Canada’s largest aquarium, the Vancouver Aquarium connects hundreds of thousands of Aquarium visitors with the natural world. With over 50,000 animals and unique opportunities to come up close with some of the world’s most elusive creatures, every visit is an unforgettable one.
